P.E.I. adds screening for COVID-19 at bridge, airport

Enhanced screening measures, including checkpoints at the Confederation Bridge, Charlottetown airport and Souris ferry terminal, will soon be put in place to battle the spread of COVID-19, P.E.I. chief public health officer Dr. Heather Morrison announced Saturday.

Officials will be asking questions and directing anyone coming from out of province, including within Canada, to self-isolate for 14 days effective immediately. That means staying home and not going to the grocery store, Morrison said in her daily briefing. The measures will be in place as soon as possible.
